

## 2023 Hall of Fame Inductee:

# *Rebecca Bagnall*

### Achievement

Rebecca Bagnall is being inducted into the VUSBC Hall of Fame for Achievement.

Rebecca Bagnall was an active bowler in Victoria for 12 years. Her family members include Stephanie, Christie, Kyle, and Kimberly, and she passed her love of bowling to her family. In addition to her four children and son-in-law being bowlers, her two grandchildren, Dylan and Gavin, are following in her bowling shoes as they are currently involved in the VUSBC Youth Bowling Program.

Rebecca has several individual and team awards for her Achievement category:

- VWBA City Tournament: Team, Div 1, 1<sup>st</sup> Place (1997, 2001, 2003, 2005)
- VWBA City Tournament: Doubles, Div 1, 1<sup>st</sup> Place (1998, 2004)
- Top 10 Female VUSBC Averages (9 years): 1994-1999, 2003-2005
- Holds three Scratch City Records for 5 Member Mixed Teams –
  - >High Game 1,211 Townhouse Apts – 1/21/2005 & 1,183 Ice House – 1997-98
  - >High Series 3,423 Townhouse Apts – 1/21/2005

In addition to her bowling accomplishments on the lanes, Rebecca served the administrative side of bowling having served on the VWBA Board of Directors and, as well as league offices of President, Secretary, Sergeant at Arms, and a YABA Coach.

When asked what she thought was her biggest bowling accomplishment, achievement, or service was, Rebecca provided the following:

- Bowled in the City Tournament every year that she bowled in a league;
- Bowled in 11 State women's tournaments and 6 Mixed State tournaments;
- Bowled in 4 National women's tournaments and 1 National Mixed tournament;
- Bowled in 1 Bluebonnet Queens tournament;
- Taking youth bowlers to 5 State tournaments.

As for what Rebecca likes best about bowling, she said "All of it!" The competitiveness, camaraderie, the fun, and even the disappointment. She said that she was not perfect and was sometimes disappointed with herself, not others. One of Rebecca's fondest moments in bowling was helping with a Handi-Capable State Tournament held at Century Lanes. She said she learned so much from the kids and they really made an impression on her.
