

Tweedle edges Silgero for top series

Justin Tweedle led the Sugar & Spice League with a 678 total and scored one total pin more than Jacob Silgero's 677 set posted during Monday Mixed play.

Tweedle rolled individual games of 222, 247 and 209 for his total. Silgero used a great 280 final game to boost his series.

Other bowlers breaking the 250-650 mark were Tom Crowe (663), John Cooper (652), Steve Dickinson (262) and Steve Zeplin (255).

Christine Speer was high for the ladies again when she rolled a 607 series during Sugar & Spice play. She posted individual games of 194, 224 and 189 for her score.

Also scoring well in the same league were Trudy Wortham 212-579, Patricia Robles with an excellent 247 high game contributing toward a 571, and Sharon Guinn with a 570.

A local team, 5 Buddies, moved into second place in the Texas State USABC Open now being competed in Lubbock with a score of 3,476. Team members are Jacob Silgero, Ricky Kendrick, Dave Matthews, Tom Crowe and Mike Stacy. Currently holding the fourth-place spot in the Div 2 doubles event are Tom Crowe and Dave Matthews with a score of 1,429. Ida Caballero and Steve Zeplin are in ninth place in Div 3 doubles with a score of 1,425. Matthews is in sixth place in Div 2 all events with a score of 2,164.

In the annual Texas State USBC Women's tournament, local bowlers are also currently among the top 10 on the leaderboard. Irma Garcia holds the third-place spot in Div 4 singles with a 755 series and Kathy Kern moved into fourth place with a 739 in Div 5 singles. In the team event, local team Lady Cats scored a 2,693 total to sit in first place in Div 5. Another local team, Family Ties, is in fifth place in Div 4 with a score of 2,704. The singles and doubles are being competed in San Antonio and the team event in New Braunfels. The tournament ends June 24.

Cooley, Marques win senior titles

Diane Cooley and Bobby Marques emerged as the Senior City Mixed Champions after competing in the 33rd Annual Victoria Senior Mixed Tournament last weekend. Cooley finished with a 1,353 handicap six-game total and Marques totaled 1,388 for the six games. This was Cooley's second city title, having previously won in 2016.

The tournament consists of teams and singles competition with all events winners based on gender and age. The bowler with the top overall all events score in each gender is considered the senior city champion.

In the male singles event, Ronnie Palmer won first place with a score of 736. Tony Bennet (719) and John Cavazos (704) placed second and third, respectively. Cecilia Wilson won the women's singles with a score of 683 and Whiz Adkins placed second with 670.

The team "Out Of Towners + 2" won the team event with a score of 2,699. Diane Cooley led the team with a 723 series. Other members are Jim Cooley, Jim Lesikar and Jay Weber.
