

Silgero has mixed results in leading this week's bowlers (8.31.2023)

In the opening session of the 2023-24 Monday Mixed League, Jacob Silgero had an enthusiastic start and a disappointing last game.

After carving out two great games of 255 and 265, a ball change in the seventh frame of the third game led to three open split frames in the last four frames.

He rolled a clean first game and then started the second game with a double before chopping the 3-6-10 in the third for the only non-strike in the game. After starting the third game with three 10-pin spares and a double in the first six frames he decided to change balls for better carry.

Unfortunately, it was the wrong choice because he started tugging the ball to leave high hit splits. Jacob was disappointed in himself for not making lane adjustments instead of changing balls. It is just something to keep in mind next time an adjustment is needed. The 23-strike performance earned him a 686 series and high for the week.

Gary Hatter Jr. was a little more consistent with individual games of 214, 259, and 214 for a 678 and second high. Steve Dickinson rolled a 233 high game on his way to a 668 and third high.

Other bowlers breaking the 250-650 mark for the week were DoLee Knowlan (666), Rob Lyman (666), Michael Conchola (263-650), and Mike Wortham (257).

Teri Mason led the women's high scoring this week with 234 high game and 570 series in the first week of Wild Turkey action.

Kayla Shaffer posted the second high score on Monday Mixed with a 211-558.

Rob Lyman led the Wild Turkey league with his 666 total.
